Action Cards: - o Skip: The next player loses their turn. - o Reverse: Reverses the direction of play. - o Draw Two: The next player must draw two cards and loses their turn. - o Wild: Allows you to change the color of the Discard Pile. - o Wild Draw Four: Allows you to change the color of the Discard Pile and forces the next player to draw four cards and lose their turn. This card can only be played if you have no other card in your hand that matches the color of the top card of the Discard Pile. 5. Calling "Uno!": When you have only one card left, you must say "Uno!" (or click the "Uno" button in the online game). If you forget and another player catches you before the next player takes their turn, you must draw two cards as a penalty. 6. Play continues until one player has no cards left. Pro Tips and Strategies to Dominate Uno Online: • Hold onto your Wild and Wild Draw Four cards: These are your most powerful cards, so save them for when you really need them. Use them strategically to change the color when you're stuck or to punish a player who's about to go out. • Pay attention to what colors are being played: Try to get rid of cards in colors that are being played frequently, as you're more likely to get stuck with them later. • Bluff! If you have a Wild Draw Four, don't be afraid to pretend you have a matching color and wait for the perfect moment to unleash it. The element of surprise can be devastating. • Remember who played what: Keep track of which players have already played certain colors and numbers. This can help you predict what cards they might be holding and plan your moves accordingly. • If you can go out, go out! Don't be greedy. If you have a chance to get rid of all your cards, take it! You never know when your luck might change. • Use the Draw Two strategically: Don't just blindly throw down Draw Twos. Use them to disrupt players who are close to going out or to punish players who are hoarding cards. • Consider your opponents' personalities (if possible): If you're playing with friends or family online, you probably know their playing styles. Use that knowledge to your advantage. Does your friend always hoard Draw Twos? Be prepared! • Practice, practice, practice! The more you play, the better you'll become at reading your opponents, anticipating their moves, and making strategic decisions.
